

The Pragmatic Application of Remote Viewing in the Hospital Environment

A Project Proposal

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Abstract

It could be argued that the greatest chasm between scholarly disciplines is the disparity between the physical sciences and beliefs in the human spirit, where the physical sciences regard the word 'spirit' as taboo in scientific research. The psychic gifts of Ingo Swann initiated a program of research that became known as 'Remote Viewing' that was used by the US Department of Defence for spying on the Soviet Union during the 'cold war'. Remote viewing has since been accessible to members of the public who are learning how to use it for a variety of applications, including making money on the financial markets. However, no one appears to be using it for practical applications in health and medicine, despite the fact that extensive research has been conducted that brings remote viewing into the arena of health and healing. This project will attempt to answer why this is so and will offer an application of remote viewing that has never been applied before in a scientific experiment.

Aims and Objectives

This research project aims to challenge existing boundaries between the mainstream sciences of physics and biology with the hypothesis that the spirit survives the death of the physical body.

The theory that the spirit leaves the physical body when it dies and goes to another plane of existence is not new. In fact, extensive research by the *Society for Psychical Research* in London has been accumulating evidence to support the theory since 1882. However, this evidence continues to be ignored by medicine to the detriment of many people who could potentially benefit from such knowledge.

So, if the theory is true, what happens to the spirit when it leaves the body and what are the implications for the living?

The Experimental Hypothesis

An earthbound spirit is that of a person who has died but their spirit (or soul) remains bound to the earth instead of moving on to the higher planes of the spirit realms. Reports suggest that earthbound spirits are commonly found on battlefields, road accident locations, sites of terrorist bombings and in hospitals where they have died from old age or disease. They remain earthbound for a variety of reasons. There are many people with psychic abilities who can see them, but most people do not have the knowledge or skills to deal with them in an appropriate way. Visitors to hospitals often walk out with an earthbound spirit attached to them without being aware of it. Earthbounds can also affect a person with the disease that they died of, creating unexplained symptoms in a living patient. Health care professionals who work in hospitals and clinics, in general, do not believe in such notions and therefore do not have the knowledge or expertise to deal with them. This research will attempt to rectify this with empirical data.

Health care professionals need to be aware of the presence of earthbound spirits in their working environment and be able to release them from living patients. It is very important to be aware of the possibility that no treatment or therapy of any kind will work effectively if there are unseen spirits attached to a patient. This has far-reaching implications and needs to be taken seriously.

The experimental hypothesis suggests that in any hospital there will be earthbound spirits of people who have died, and that such spirits can be identified with the aid of remote viewing, which is, after all, just another name for clairvoyance (clear seeing).

The Experimental Method

For this experiment a remote spirit release (or soul rescue) team will comprise of three persons:

- (a) the viewer and
- (b) the investigator.
- (c) the recorder.

The clairvoyant remote viewer (a) will 'scan' a hospital ward where someone has recently died in order to 'see' if any patients have left their bodies and remained earthbound. If the viewer (a) reports seeing or hearing (clairaudience) any earthbound spirit he / she will inform the investigator (b) who will engage the earthbound spirit in dialogue and ask them the following questions:

1. What is your name?
2. Do you know where you are? (do you know you are dead?)
3. Do you know what has happened to you? (What did you die of?)
4. Why are you still here? (Why did you not cross over to the Light?)

The recorder (c) will record all communications for transcription and analysis.

The answers given will provide the experimenters with data that can be checked with patient records and verified or not, as the case may be.

Corroboration between the answers given by the earthbound spirits and patient records will support the experimental hypothesis.

It is important that the remote viewers and investigators have no knowledge of any patients on any of the hospital wards at any time during the experiments.

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
